Philippine Province Member Father Mark del Rosario SSS Installed as Pastor of Saint Joseph Downtown, San Antonio

On Saturday, July 29, the vigil of the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Filipino-American Father Mark del Rosario SSS became the new pastor of the historic Riverwalk church of Saint Joseph Downtown in the Archdiocese of San Antonio. (You might have read his biography in Bread, Broken & Shared – summer edition 2023, also available on our website.)

The Provincial Superior of the Philippine Province, Very Reverend Roel della Cruz SSS, and the provincial secretary, Fr Bryan Adona SSS flew from Manila and their SSS headquarters there to represent Fr Mark's home province and the new collaboration between the Provinces of Saint Ann (USA) and Our Lady of the Assumption (*Philippines*). Since Fr Mark came from his prior assignment as pastor in Pueblo, Colorado, Fr Joseph Matitu SSS, a community member, drove down and joined the celebration. Fellow dear friend, SSS Fr Anthony Pangan SSS, came from the Diocese of Honolulu to represent Fr Mark's former parish and work in that diocese. Just as important, Fr Joseph Thai Minh Tran SSS kicked off the celebrations as local SSS house leader. For six years, he has been a steady presence in the community as a parochial vicar with the former



and me from the recent procession of the Blessed Sacrament through the downtown streets of San Antonio on the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 11, 2023.

A little history. Our San Antonio Associates had a dream: to have a special annual procession in the streets of downtown to make known the importance of the Risen Lord

in the Blessed Sacrament. We all know that this was an important day for our founder, and he found our religious inspired to was congregations based on a procession of the Blessed Sacrament in Lyons, France. In Eymard's day, it was called "Corpus Christi" and was held on Thursdays. With an updated liturgical calendar in 1969, we now, as we know, call this day a solemnity of the church, combining the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist on this day – a Sunday – the Lord's Day – with a new longer name and the hope of a special procession with the Eucharist exposed in a monstrance for a procession!

Our associates took this historical, theological, presenting Fath and liturgical history of our institute seriously the community and inspired Archbishop Gustavo and the

archdiocesan offices to promote this event in the life of the Church of San Antonio. Planning was for over a year; it was interesting to hear the different pieces that made the procession successful. Our associates catechized, worshiped, and shared this gift of the Eucharistic mystery with so many tourists and locals, even giving them flower petals to throw in honor of the Blessed Sacrament and this extraordinary, one-of-a-kind procession. Archbishop and our associates are planning for next year's celebration, and we brainstormed how to improve it. Y'all come!

Saturday night (the vigil of the Lord's Day), Bishop Gary Janak, the new auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of San Antonio, installed Fr Mark because Archbishop Gustavo Garcia-Siller was in Mexico attending to his father, who is ill. Bishop Gary is formerly the rector of the cathedral and priest of the Diocese of Victoria, Texas. He was very personable and enjoyable. Members of the parish provided a delicious potluck dinner and a sizeable congratulatory cake and cupcakes to begin the pastorate of Fr Mark.

Sacrament. With our SSS presence since 1982, we hope for it to grow for many years in the first joint pastorate of both provinces of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament. It is a historic first to have a joint mission between provinces – one repeated now also in Holiday, Florida, where we will install another new pastor at the end of September. Details to come!
