


On Saturday, January 27, 2024, the Corpus Christi parish community (Houston, Texas) celebrated Father Thomas Smithson SSS and thanked him for his 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ of devoted service to our parish. (Father Tom is the longestserving SSS pastor and second longest pastor of our parish, second only to the founding pastor, Msgr. Cornelius Flynn, who served 20 years.) The evening's festivities began with Father Tom presiding at the 5:00 PM Vigil Mass, joined by Father Paul Raj Gnanasekar (Sekar) SSS and Deacon William Castro. Over 300 people attended the Mass.




The potluck dinner began with the blessing of the food by Father Tom. More than 375 people attended the dinner, including former

Father Sekar, our new pastor, shared beautiful words of thanks and appreciation for Father Tom's years of service to the parish and his unwavering dedication to the growth and success of the school. He mentioned how he has willingly given of himself in so many ways. One example is Father Tom's care and compassion









towards the houseless and those in need who come ringing the rectory doorbell asking for assistance. Father Sekar thanked him for his remarkable leadership in overseeing the completion of the renovations in the church, especially given the delays and the challenges posed by the pandemic.

Father Tom's selfless and caring nature has made a lasting impression on the community. It saddened everyone when he announced that he would no longer serve as pastor. However, he quickly explained that he would continue his service in hospital ministry within Houston's Catholic Chaplain Corp, serving at Women's Hospital and HCA Hospital nearby. Hearing this brought joy to the community, as they knew they would still have him around. Although they will miss him as their pastor, they are excited to see how he will continue to impact the lives of everyone he meets in his new ministry.

Pastoral Visit to Houston, Texas SSS Indian Father Gnanasekar Becomes 8th Pastor of Corpus Christi Parish

On January 1, 2024, Blessed Sacrament Father Paul Raj Gnanasekar *(commonly known as Father Sekar)* from the Indian Province of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament became the third international priest to serve in a Saint Ann Province (USA) parish as pastor. On Saturday, February 3, 2024, Father Sekar liturgically became the eighth pastor in a special installation rite at Corpus Christi Roman Catholic Church, Houston, Texas.

The installation rite began with a special gathering the night before, Friday, February 2, with the Associates of the Blessed hosting a reception in the parish rectory. As usual, our Associates have the best foods with recipes from around the world. Our Associates hail from so many ethnic backgrounds in this parish, which adds to the richness of our community. And, in case you were wondering, there were also many amazing desserts that had been blessed to be calorie-free.

Representing the Cardinal-Archbishop Daniel DiNardo of Galveston-Houston, who was out of town, Episcopal Vicar (for the region of the archdiocese that our parish is in), the Very

Reverend Lawrence Jozwiak, JCL, began the Mass with a ritual. This author, on behalf of Father D. Peter Jayakanthan, SSS, provincial of our Indian province, presented Father Sekar to the cardinal's representative, Father Lawrence, and the people of Corpus Christi. Father Sekar also had his new Pastoral Staff, School Faculty and Staff, Pastoral Council, Finance Council, and other ministries present to hear him pledge his service and need for their collaboration. (*Previously, Father Sekar served in India as pastor, provincial, novice director, and in other ministries in his almost 32 years of being an SSS priest.*)

Father Lawrence then gave an eight-minute reflection on the duties of a pastor and encouraged Father Sekar to



share his many gifts and talents with the parish. I was invited to give the homily and focused on the unique gifts that an SSS parish witnesses and how Father Sekar and the parish have this chance to improve upon the great traditions in this almost 70-year-old parish in a beautifully newly renovated worship space. After the homily, Fathers Lawrence and Sekar signed a special oath of faithfulness that was presented to the parish with the archdiocesan seal.



Following the Saturday vigil installation Mass, everyone enjoyed a light reception hosted by


the Catholic Women's ministry in the parish hall, named after the 4th pastor, Father Roger Prefontaine. The first two pastors of Corpus Christi were diocesan priests, serving twenty-five years. Archbishop Joseph Fiorenza invited the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament to administer the parish in 1987. Fathers Roland LaLiberté, Roger Prefontaine, John Thomas Lane, Dana Pelotte, and Thomas Smithson served during this time.

Additionally, during my time in Houston, I met with Reverend James Burkart, a life-long friend who will lead the Saint Ann

Triduum, July 24 – 26, 2024, at Saint Paschal Baylon, Highland Heights, Ohio. We met to begin the

planning for this event. Father James is known for his great homilies and excellent pilgrimages, having just led one to the holy sites of Canada, including Saint Ann's shrine in Quebec. There is also a new vicar for clergy in the archdiocese, so I met with the Very Reverend Clark Sample to discuss our current and future ministries. He, too, has known of our SSS charism and our community members over the years. He is delighted that we have two religious hospital chaplains, Fathers Tom Smithson (USA) and Christian Christopher (Sir Lanka), ministering so

well in the medical center of downtown Houston. Finally, as I do on most of my pastoral trips, I met with a vocation candidate, a lay hospital chaplain named Anthony Hyginus, who lives nearby and was recommended to "come and see" our religious life by his spiritual director, another hospital chaplain "Father Jo Jo," who knows our religious community well.

The weekend went by quickly with preaching at every Mass, having an SSS community meeting with our four men in

Houston (including the doctoral student Father Joseph Doan), and enjoying a brief relaxation time with our parishioners and community friends. I am grateful for our Associates' hospitality and care as always and for the touching kindness to this former pastor of our incredible international parish in Houston - living so what they receive, the Body of Christ, Corpus Christi.
