Starting with Evening Prayers on August 5, the provincial, Father John Thomas Lane SSS, welcomed everyone present and wished us enjoyable moments with the LORD and each other.

Father Norman Pelletier SSS briefly introduced the *Rule of Life* and the *Project of Life*. Father Norman emphasized that our primary identity is that of *community* — we are a people gathered under the constant inspiration and animation of the Holy Spirit. Each Eucharistic celebration starts by gathering us together. Coming from different walks of life, we form a community, we form a Congregation, we form the Aggregation, we form the Eymardian family, and above all, we create a Eucharistic

community in which – we celebrate, worship, and live.

Our retreat reflection was focused on these two documents about community, prayer, and service; with the guidance of Mary Muehle, Father William Fickel SSS, and Brother Micheal Perez SSS –we entered into a time of personal reflections of how each of us related to the different numbers of the *Rule of Life* and the *Project of Life*. We had different groups daily, which helped us interact with different people. We look at the *Rule* and *Project's* past, present, and future living.

Our reflections were rich due to the internationality of those in attendance – we were from Uganda, Sri Lanka, Nigeria, the USA, Colombia, India, Philippines and Vietnam. At the end of the sessions, we made concrete resolutions that would help us grow in our Eucharistic calling and living. These were to help us live better lives in our communities, enhance our prayer lives, and be more practical in our service.

At the end of our Retreat, Father Norman made some closing remarks, reminding us that we are all on a journey: called to be the *Rule of Life* or *Project of Life* to be the Eucharistic charism for the life of the world. Father John Thomas Lane encouraged us: "Be the *Rule* and *Project* for the next 40 and 400 years!"
